Course Introduction

• This course provides students with a picture of how policy and planning practices in Chinese cities have evolved for the last four decades since economic reform, assists them to understand the driving forces, achievements, and challenges of urban China transition, and introduces related concepts and theories explaining specific examples of urban development in major Chinese cities such as Hong Kong and Shanghai. This course also encourages students to analyze their assignment in design workshop to assist the planning process.

• Students are required to understand major transformation of urban policy and planning since 1970s and how this transformation influences urban development. It also aims to develop analytical skills of the students, to enhance their understanding towards the role and impacts of urban planning in Chinese urban development, and improve their performance in planning and design.




