Brief Course Description 课程简述(中英文)

#### 题目:

中国当代建筑研究导论: 范式与主题

## 目的和内容:

本课程设定为硕士研究生专业选修课程,目标是训练学生对现当代中国建筑问题研究的基本方法,培养观察、分析、整理、总结、表达的综合能力。

通过本课程的学习,希望学生在以下几个方面有所收获:

- 1) 了解现代中国建筑与城市研究的基本文献、主要研究范式
- 2) 了解当代中国建筑与城市研究的基本主题,相关理论和研究方法
- 3) 通过田野调查和案例研究对某几类问题进行比较深入的研究和讨论
- 4)提升思考能力、研究能力、表达能力和团队合作能力。

## 要求:

学生被要求准时出席每次课程,积极参与讨论。每个学生要完成一次课上阅读报告,一次关于中国建筑 热点话题的课堂讨论或辩论,两次现场调研(中国实践建筑师和城市空间)的调研和报告。

Title: An Introductory Course on Studies of Modern Chinese Architecture: Paradigm and Themes

## **Course Description:**

This course is delivered as an un-compulsory course for graduate students.

The principal objective of this course is to help the students to build up basic understanding and familiarity of the basic sources and research methodology through the course of paradigms and themes in the field of modern Chinese architecture, as well as experience of training in the ability

of observation, analysis, summarization, and expressions.

Attendants are proposed to go through basic process including readings, presentations, case studies(in group) and seminars to be trained in the following aspects:

- 1) To get the basic knowledge of primary sources and paradigms on the topic of modern Chinese Architecture and urbanism;
- 2) To acquire the basic familiarity with prevailing topics, related theories and methodologies;
- 3) To make in-depth survey through a case study on certain specific issue;
- 4) To cultivate the ability of thinking, research, expression and group cooperation.

## **Requirements:**

On-time attendance of each class is required and the students should actively participate in discussions. Each group is required to give one literature review. There would be 1 class discussion and 2 on site research programs. Each group is required to finish 2 research reports (Chinese practical architects and Shanghai Urban Regeneration and public spaces).

HUA Xiahong, PhD in Architectural History and Theories, is an assoc. professor at the School of Architecture in CAUP. Her career includes both university teaching/researching and public practice. Her academic interests focus on the relationship between contemporary architecture and Consumer Culture, the vitality of public space in community complex, Laszlo Hudec's life and architecture, modern and contemporary architectural development in China as well as the practice of the emerging Chinese young architects. Her most recent book is *Shanghai Hudec Architecture* (2013), *Contemporary Architecture in Consumer Culture* (forthcoming). She is also the cultural advisor of Atelier Archmixing and a part-time editor of *Time Architecture* Magazine.

WANG Kai holds a ph.D in Architectural History and Theory, he is an assistant professor in Architecture of Tongji University. His interest covers two main fields: the emergence of modern
