Course Syllabus 课程大纲(中英文)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course aims to give a critical overview on contemporary urban planning and design in China, focusing on the last twenty years, in a global comparing perspective. Through local site visits, presentations and analysis of case studies, explanations of tendencies and complex urban problems, and group discussions the students should be able to understand more about the fascinating and complex status quo of urban planning and design. At the end of the course students are expected to reflect on this and give their own analytical view and critics on one of the discussed themes and express this in an essay or short documentary video.

The course aims to go beyond the dominant international perspective and tries to understand, define and question, and distinguish new paradigms for China's rapid urbanization. The series will introduce a range of themes and case studies to analyze contemporary practices and experiences and to give better insight and understanding of recent urban planning and design.

During the course several urgent themes and practical methodologies will be discussed in international perspective (e.g. the use of scenarios, integral area development, city and health, city and water, urban-rural relationship, urban governance, public spaces, heritage, community and identity) also in relation to the expected further urbanization

REQUIREMENTS

Students taking this course are required to attend the lectures delivered by course instructor and invited speakers, and to actively participate in the group discussions.

Before the end of the semester, each student is required to create a video documentary or write an essay on one of the themes discussed during the course, focusing on Shanghai.

SCHEDULE OF READINGS AND LECTURE TOPICS

- Week 2 Urbanization and speed: about the unprecedented scale and speed of China's rapid growing cities
- Week 3 New town development (1): Shanghai's new town strategies and experiences.
- Week 4 New town development (2): site visit of two new towns.
- Week 5 Neighborhood development (1): community and identity, the construction of new neighborhoods.
- Week 6 Neighborhood development (2): site visit of several new neighborhoods in Shanghai.
- Week 7 Regional development and scenarios: about urban governance and the development of scenarios.
- Week 8 Density & functional mix: about the unique characteristics of China's high-density cities.
- Week 9 The new public space: changes in the use of public space, from sidewalk to shopping mall.
- Week 10 New infrastructures: transit oriented development and the construction of new urban nodes.
- Week 11 City and heritage: about identity and the Historic Urban Landscape.
- Week 12 Urban-Rural integration: about the development of the countryside and the relation with cities.
- Week 13 Urban renewal: waterfront developments, creative industries, and other functional changes.
- Week 14 Environmental challenges / city and health: about environmental concerns and challenges.
- Week 15 Tomorrowland: discussion of new urbanization models (students should hand in their essay or video).
- Week 16 Group discussion essays and videos.
